Given the small window of time before patents expire, Cytiva wanted to reduce the time from product inception to market release by streamlining system deployment and data management.

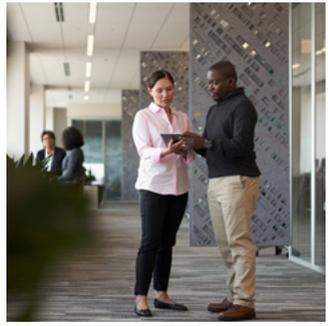

RESULTS

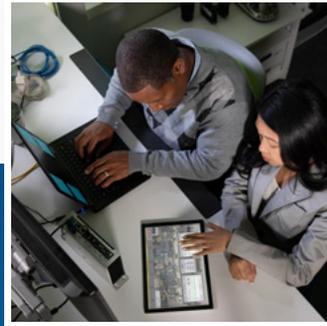

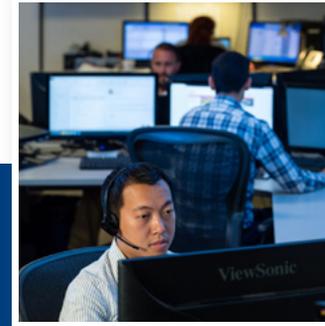
